Cover Story

Project: Major structural repair of the badly deteriorating Ottawa Towers Building, in Lansing, Michigan.

Planning: Original planning called for concrete sawing, \$50,000+ of shoring to support demolition loads, and the labor of 20+ workers with jackhammers to remove 130,000 square feet of double mat reinforced concrete structural slab.

Decision: After researching Brokk's benefits, features, and high productivity, Kares Project Manager, Alan Gurski, decided to use two B330's and one B180.

Safety: Job safety was another major concern favoring the use of Brokk equipment instead of traditional methods.

Result: The project was completed in two phases; each phase requiring 4-6 weeks to complete.

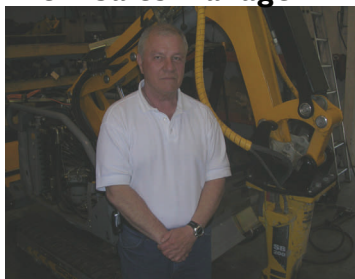

- Stronger chassis. Bearing and shaft pin reinforced to handle heavier tools. Rear attachment at wheel motors reinforced.
